PARK WATCH VOLUNTEERS LOOK FOR...

- Individuals peering into parked vehicles
- Persons loitering in poorly lit areas
- Strange noises, calls for help, or the sound of breaking glass
- Children who appear to be lost or unsupervised
- Strangers talking to children from a vehicle or on foot
- Property being vandalized, damaged, or taken
- Fighting, screaming, yelling
- People in the park after dark, except for permitted activities

PARK WATCH VOLUNTEERS REPORT....

 suspicious activities, unsafe situations, vandalism or graffiti, damaged property, and other concerns

PARK WATCH IS NOT...

- a program designed to put participants at risk or directly intervene in a crime
- · a guarantee that crime will not occur
- · a vigilante group of citizens
